UPDATE: MAINLAND TELECOM INTERNET INSTALLATION

Since late 2020, Mainland Telecom and partnering crews have worked to build the infrastructure for a fibre-optic Internet backbone in Clare. Residences and businesses in certain areas of Clare (mainly parts of Clare from St. Bernard towards Mavillette and inland to Highway 340) are now connected to high-speed Internet.

DON'T HESITATE, VACCINATE

The Clare Health Centre would like to remind you that vaccines reduce the likelihood of severe illness, such as COVID-19. When you get vaccinated, you also reduce the risk of passing on COVID-19 to your community. You can get a COVID-19 vaccine if you're 5 or older. You can book an appointment for yourself or someone else (like a parent, grandparent or child). You can also book an appointment if you're eligible for an additional dose or booster dose.

Maintaining good hygiene helps prevent the spread of COVID-19. This includes washing your hands often, coughing and sneezing into your elbow, and cleaning surfaces. Wearing a mask can help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses.

If you feel sick, stay home and watch for COVID-19 symptoms. If you have symptoms, you need to self-isolate and book a COVID-19 test. By getting tested, you help keep your community safe.

TOURISM PUBLIC SPACES

Several parts of Municipality of Clare's Tourism Public Spaces project have moved on to the detailed design phase. Architecture firm Jost + Architects Ltd. is working closely with a focus group on the revitalization of Joseph-and-Marie-Dugas Municipal Park in Belliveau Cove. Denise Saulnier Design has been contracted to produce options for a wayfinding and gateway signage system within the municipality, as well as the design of the Cape Saint Mary Lighthouse Experience Centre. Meanwhile, detailed design plans are underway for viewing platform options at the Cape Saint Mary Lighthouse Park.



FEDERAL FUNDING FOR WENTWORTH LAKE MUNICIPAL PARK

Through the federal government's Canada Community Revitalization Fund (CCRF) and in line with the Municipality of the District of Clare's Tourism Public Spaces Master Plan, Wentworth Lake Municipal Park will receive a \$200,000 investment to improve accessibility and enhance the visitor experience. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$271,154, the remainder of which will be funded by the Municipality of Clare.

"Wentworth Lake Municipal Park, although beautiful and pristine, is further inland compared to most of our municipal infrastructure," stated Stéphane Cyr, Chief Administrative Officer for the Municipality of Clare. "We see this project as a meaningful opportunity to counter this trend and to invest in public spaces further away from the shore."

In addition to being green and environmentally friendly, all new construction, amenities and improvements contained in this project will be viewed through an accessibility lens so as promote greater inclusivity. Accessible washrooms, trail resurfacing and the addition of inclusive playground equipment are three tangible examples of this commitment.



CLARE ACCESSIBILITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

With the goal of respecting Nova Scotia's objective of being an accessible province by 2030, the Municipality of Clare has formed an Accessibility Advisory Committee. It will advise Council on identifying, preventing and eliminating barriers to people with disabilities in municipal programs, services, initiatives and facilities while meeting its obligations under Nova Scotia's Accessibility Act.

Members of the Accessibility Advisory Committee are community members Trudy Bengivenni, Edwin Deveau and Lonnie McNeill, councillors Nadine Comeau and Brian Comeau, Deputy Warden Eric Pothier and the Municipality's Accessibility Coordinator Tori Comeau. Their first mandate is to produce an Accessibility Plan for the Municipality of Clare.

WHAT IS CFA DE CLARE?

Did you know that Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) has designated the Municipality of Clare as one of 14 Welcoming Francophone Communities (CFAs) in Canada? This four-year pilot project (2020-2024) aims to help make the community of Clare more welcoming to all and to ensure that all community members have a positive attitude towards new immigrants, including those who wish to settle in French.

A partnership between the Municipality of Clare and la Société acadienne de Clare, CFA de Clare aims to promote inclusive leadership, equitable access to reception and settlement services, economic and employment opportunities and community involvement through a variety of special activities and services.

FEBRUARY ART CHALLENGE

CFA de Clare teamed up with le Conseil des Arts de la Baie to present the Févri-Art 2022 art challenge. From February 1 to 28, artists of all levels were encouraged to make a work of art every day, every week or at their leisure, and to share their creations online on the Févri-Art 2022 Facebook group.

This year, CFA de Clare gave away two types of art kits to people who are new to Clare and who are curious about art. Kit 1 contained supplies for at-home printmaking and clay sculpting, while Kit 2 included acrylic painting supplies.

Activities included an exhibit on African Canadian changemakers, an online evening of film celebrating black women, as well as a community meal. A NEW WELCOMING PUBLIC SPACE

December 2021 marked the grand opening of the Clare community skating rink, an initiative funded by the Municipality of Clare and CFA de Clare. Located next to the Clare Veterans Centre in Saulnierville and consisting of a system of interlocking synthetic ice panels, the 12×24 metre (40×80 feet) rink is designed for year-round use. This will allow families who have immigrated to Clare to skate without necessarily having to adapt to our winter climate.

The municipality and CFA de Clare have set up a loan program for children's and adult skates, as well as skate aids, field hockey sticks and helmets. CFA de Clare also offers a learn-to-skate program for newcomers to the community.



COMMUNITY MEALS IN 2022
